- Who should attend? School and school system leaders
- What's the time commitment? 2 days on Nov. 28-29 plus travel. We recommend arriving the evening of Nov. 27.
- What's included? Your visit includes transportation between schools, breakfast and lunch. See the agenda for details, including links to local hotels and restaurants.
- What does it cost? AASA will cover the cost of registrations (typically \$400 per person) for AASA Learning 2025 Network members (up to 4 per district) attending the Nov. 28-29 visit.
