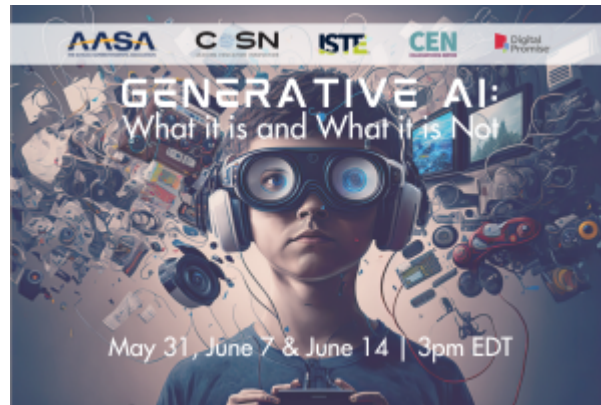

Department of Education’s “Online for All” program. This initiative was launched through a partnership between [Civic Nation](#) and the U.S. Department of Education. Secretary Cardona stressed that “access to the Internet is not a luxury, it is a necessity” and that there is an urgency now to close the digital divide. He stated that today there is more federal support than ever to help solve the issue of Internet access for all.

The concern that Secretary Cardona and others expressed during the online session is the fact that ***many people who could benefit from the financial assistance being offered to help provide Internet Access for all are not aware of those resources.*** It is in that regard that they are reaching out to education leaders to assure that all who might need assistance know how to apply and receive it.

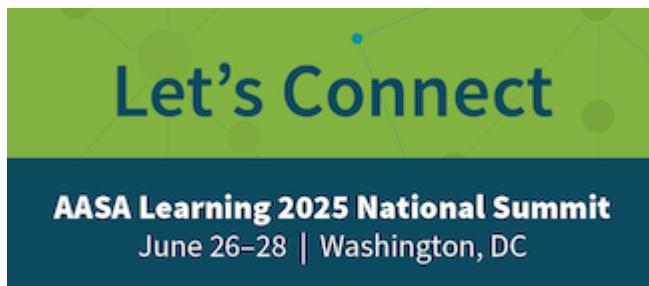
