Montana is part of an umbrella organization so there may be resources available to help with bringing speakers to our state conference.

The national conferences will be split this year but starting in the summer of 2024, the national conference will be a joint conference similar to what our state conference does.

He updated us on some legislative proposals being brought forth at the national level including a loan forgiveness program that includes administrators, Title II-A funding increase, and Title IV-A funding increase.

Gordon shared that NASSP has created a text form that will send calls to action directly to our Congressional delegation. He shared that this will save time for members and is very user friendly. The state organization will also be looking into how to make this possible at the state level. He will keep us updated.

Gordon also shared with the group his excitement with the new National Executive Director and his vision for the organization. He really emphasized how nice it was to hear that the Director's focus will be to serve the state organizations more effectively.
