This past fall, facing significant challenges created by the COVID pandemic and a politically charged atmosphere, SAM and our education partners outlined a strategy to capture the attention of the local community members so that our communities would not stand idly by as orchestrated attacks on local schools appears to have become a nation-wide, well organized and funded effort. Those in our nation, who would want to privatize our public schools for profit, are behind this effort, and in checking with education leaders across the country (recent discussions in February at the AASA National Conference on Education and the NAESP NASSP National Advocacy Leaders

Conferences), this movement is happening in a coordinated way in all states across the nation. The challenge for Montana, as outlined in the SAM strategy, is that a loss of support for the public school in your community may very likely result in the closing of your school because of the lack of ability to retain quality staff under the conditions of constant attack that have been experienced. As pointed out, this form of consolidation is nefarious, happening right in front of us, and will be the death knell for small communities living in our healthy, independent nature here in Montana.

SAM Strategic Plan Goals



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
