## **CALL TO ACTION - OPPOSE SB235**

Also - I would like you to consider writing a short note opposing SB235, which will be heard **Monday**, **Feb 6 at 3pm in Senate Education.** (Reminder that the committees don't generally take any action during the hearing. If you miss the deadline for the hearing - you can still send a message opposing the bill, as the committee will likely take a week or so before they take action on this bill.)

## What does this bill do?

Essentially, it would change how we teach Science. The bill seeks to prohibit schools from teaching "science theory" and limits all Science education in K-12 schools to "science fact.". Science fact is defined as anything that is observable and repeatable. If it does not meet those two criteria then it is considered science theory and **can't be** taught in K12 schools.

#### What does this mean?

Taken to the extreme, a vast majority of what we teach in Science is based on theory. (For example, depending on where you are, you would never be able to "observe" that the earth was round. Your observations would tell you that the earth is flat. This is an extreme example, but you get the idea.)

#### How do we oppose it?

The opposition to this bill is fairly straight forward. The MT constitution reserves these types of curriculum decisions to the Board of Public Ed (Article X, Section 9) and to the locally elected board of trustees (Article X, Section 8). The state legislature should not be making decisions that impact what is taught in school. Those types of decisions are constitutionally protected decisions for the Board of Public Ed and the local School Board. Also see MCA 20-3-324 and MCA 20-4-301, both of which clearly define the local board's role in developing the educational program and course of study.

You can also argue that teaching theory is really all about helping students increase their critical thinking skills. This is a skill that most would expect from our K-12 system, if our ultimate goal is to develop an educated populace who can think for themselves.

#### How do we send a message?

There are a couple of ways to reach the Senate Ed Committee. If you know someone on the committee, I would encourage you to reach out to them directly.
