

The Secretary of Education has established Regional Advisory Committees (RACs), one for each region served by the Regional Educational Laboratories, in order to collect information on the education needs of each region and how those needs may be addressed through technical assistance activities.

The RACs will seek input regarding the need for technical assistance activities and how those needs would be most effectively addressed. The goal of these processes is to solicit the views and needs of schools, educators, parents, teachers, administrators, members of the regional educational laboratory governing board, LEAs, librarians, businesses, SEAs, and other customers (such as adult education programs) within the region regarding the need for the activities described in 20 U.S.C. sections 9564 and 9602 and how those needs would be most effectively addressed.

All RAC meetings will be open to members of the public. Montana is part of the Northwest region. The next meeting is scheduled for September 19, 2023, from 12:00 p.m. to 1:30 p.m. MT

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
